Superintendent's Corner



Merger Update: The Feasibility Committee has completed its process, CASDA has written the report, and New York State is reviewing it. The State will review the report and let CASDA/us know if additional information is needed and if the information that has been provided is accurate. How long this will take is unknown. Once the State approves the report, it will be presented to both Boards of Education at a joint meeting. At this meeting, the Boards will ask clarifying questions to ensure that they have a clear understanding of what merging the two districts will mean for their school and district communities.

Unlike the feasibility committee meetings, where the public was not allowed to ask questions, at this meeting, community members could ask clarifying questions at the end. This will allow the community to ensure they have accurate information for the next meeting.

The next meeting will be separate for both schools/communities but on the same night. Community members are encouraged to attend this meeting and give their opinions for or against the merger. This meeting is not a debate, it is not set up to agree or disagree with each other's opinions. It is a time to express your thoughts on the merger to the Boards of Education, so when they vote at the end of the meeting they have allowed community members to share their thoughts on the merger. Everyone is expected to respect (may not agree) each other as they share their opinions. We will use the

same rules during this meeting as we use with public comments during our regular Board meetings.

At the end of this meeting, both Boards of Education will vote on whether or not to continue the process to a Straw Vote. This vote is the first of two possible public votes. Unfortunately, I do not have dates for this process because we have not received the report back from the State yet. As soon as we do, we will post the dates on our webpage and Facebook.



Budget: On Tuesday, May 21, the Johnsburg Central School Board will be putting forth the 2024-2025 school budget. Please look further in this newsletter for all the budget information that you will need to cast your vote. 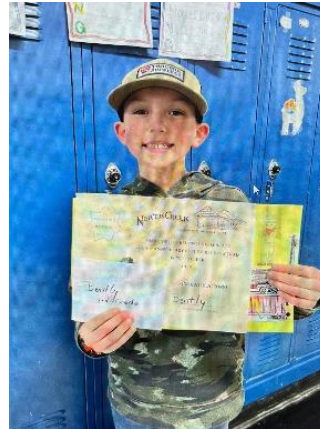


Congratulations!

Information from the Health Office:

Johnsburg Families,

Sports Physicals for fall are offered on June 6th to ensure every athlete is up-to-date when Fall sports start in August. Please encourage your athlete to sign up with me in the nurse's office.

Every student entering grades PK, K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 11th must have a physical within 12 months of starting the upcoming school year. Please schedule your child's well visit before fall to ensure they have an up-to-date physical on file. Make sure to check with your child's healthcare provider to see if they are up to date on the vaccine requirements for NYS school entry. Vaccine requirements must be met within 14 days of the start of each school year. School exclusion is required if vaccine requirements are not met.

COVID-19 Test kits are still available from the Main office should you need any.

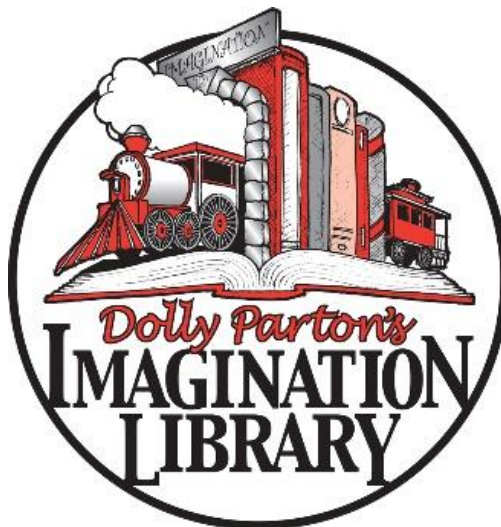
